Stanway Parish

As you know I have always been an SSM (Self-supporting minister) on a part-time, unpaid basis. It will not be possible to continue that arrangement here after I leave in August so the idea is that the parish of Stanway will be served by the same full-time priest as the parish of Shrub End. They have not had an incumbent for over five years and the process of recruitment and appointment involving the PCCs of both parishes has now begun.

With that in mind we have begun a regular pattern of joint services in our respective churches, so that we can get to know each other better. This began at St. Albright's on 4th May and we have had two since at Shrub End. **This Sunday**, **6th July**, the service will be at Shrub End. Thereafter, there will be a parish lunch at St. Cedd's Church. This will be an opportunity to get to know each other better in an informal setting. Please come if you can.

The pattern will continue with services at Shrub End on the first Sunday of the month and at St. Albright's on the fourth or fifth. In the meantime do pray for our friends at Shrub End and for future closer working together.

The General Synod of the C of E meets in York from 11th to 15th July. Please pray for all members, their debates and decision making.

The group for maintaining the churchyard is still happy to have any more volunteers. Giving and Stewardship

Along with most parish churches, St. Albright's relies almost entirely on voluntary giving. We have received grants for specific projects, such as for the new roof and for our pioneering ministry, along with donations and legacies (some very generous) plus fee income from weddings and the like, but the everyday running of the church and our essential contribution to the wider Church, the diocese, comes from the giving of individuals. There is no state aid or subsidy, something which many find surprising. However, giving to the Church in terms of time and talents as well as money, has always been a fundamental aspect of being a Christian - supporting each other within the Christian community is a firm Biblical principle and one which we achieve at St. Albright's. So giving is not just a worthy and good thing to

do, it is an important, vital, part of being Church and of continuing our witness and ministry to the parish.

There is now a clear shortfall between our giving and our outgoings and there will be a circulated shortly to everyone on the electoral roll setting out our financial situation and the importance of Christian stewardship.

These days there are many ways to give:

We now have a new card reader in church so that donations may be made using a debit or credit card.

It is also possible to donate to St. Albright's online. There is a dedicated page on the website to make giving much easier.

If you would like further details about how to give, and there are many ways to do so, then please contact any of the ministry team or churchwardens. We particularly welcome regular giving, however small, either using weekly envelopes or by standing order, and, if you are a taxpayer we can reclaim Gift Aid.

It is also possible to sponsor a day in the life of the church. You may wish to make a one-off donation in memory of someone or to celebrate a particular event. Please contact any of the ministry team or Churchwardens.
